This is a very meaningful ministry for both the recipient and the minister. Visits can be done days, evenings, or weekends, and are usually once every 5 weeks. Training provided. **Is a family member hospitalized?** ~ Please let the Pastoral Care office at the **hospital** know that you are from St. Thomas Parish so you can be put on the HIPPA list and can receive parish visits. Due to privacy policies, we may not know that you have admitted.
