St. Thomas the Apostle parish is** partnering with the faith-based organization, The Water Project, to **build a well for an impoverished community in central Africa.** The cost of a well is between \$12,000 and \$15,000. Through spring fundraisers, as well as the contributions of parishioners and members of the community, we are on our way to reaching our financial target.

**A well will offer "real opportunities" to an African community in four distinct ways:**

- **Health:** Water-related diseases can be reduced.
- ♦ **Education:** Young girls are often the members of the community who must miss school to walk miles each day to fill jugs with water to bring back to the families. Access to clean water in their village will allow them to go to school.
- **Hunger:** Crops to provide nutritious foodstuffs can be grown with an adequate supply of water.
- **Economy:** Communities can develop and grow when members are healthy, educated and well-fed as a result of access to a life-sustaining fresh water supply.

**KIDZ LUNCHBOX ~ The Capital Area Council of Churches (CACC)** is an ecumenical organization that provides support to those living in impoverished neighborhoods in Albany, NY and surrounding communities. One of CACC's programs is the "Kidz Lunchbox". This mobile program provides lunches to children in the West Hill and South End neighborhoods of Albany during the summer. Although many children are eligible for school lunch programs throughout the school year, lunch during the summer months is often fraught with barriers. The Kidz Lunchbox program was designed as a stopgap measure to address food insecurity and child hunger in Albany.

**Volunteers are needed** to help pack and/or distribute lunches through August 10. The program operates every Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday. Lunch packers gather at the First Lutheran Church, 646 State St, Albany at 11:00 and are usually finished by 11:30. All food and materials are provided. Lunch deliveries go from 11:30 to 12:30.
