Most of those residents can no longer get to Mass and rely on these services for continued spiritual growth. They are so very appreciative of our services. **Recycling is one way in which we can care for creation, can “translate” into action our hopes and prayers for our world.**

- This September St. Thomas Youth Ministry is sponsoring a returnable can and bottle drive. Proceeds will be donated to the parish water project fund. **To participate, pick up a CLYNK envelope and recycle bag at the display in the Gathering Hall. Fill your bag with New York State returnable bottles and cans, transfer the bag tag from the CLYNK envelope to the green recycle bag and bring it back to St. Thomas the weekend of Sept. 9 and 10** or to a local Hannaford supermarket anytime.

- Check your home for re-useable items such as last year’s ruler, or pencils/pens you already own.
- Consider reusable forks and spoons for school lunches, rather than disposables.
